Introduction:

Shammah Children Centre is a community Based Organization founded by Florence Mweu in the year 5/1/2009. The centre started with 4 learners who were very vulnerable. The founder pleaded with business people in Kangundo town where the center is, to help with foodstuffs so the learners would feed in school. The business people contributed foodstuffs beyond the founder's imagination. Before the month ended, the centre had enrolled almost 30 kids.

Through Mrs Hanneke Van Bruggen, FAPADAG, Wilde Ganzen, the centre has grown to a big school starting from playgroup 3 years up to 14 years of age. Thank you team Hanneke for your continued efforts and support to make Shammah centres what they are. The community as a whole is very thankful beyond words.

Our hope is to see Shammah grow to a big institution for all learners regardless of their abilities, status and background.

PUPILS/LEARNERS

The year 2025 was not a good year for the Shammah Centres since they had lost one of the founders, Jemimah who played a very big role of coordinating all the Shammah centres so it was a very big blow to both Centres and to her mother too.

At the end of 1st term 2025 the centre had enrolled 176 learners. By the end of 3rd term, the enrolment went up to 263. In Pre-primary 2 class of 2025, 67 learners graduated for the primary school journey which needs a smooth transition. All grades needs a smooth transition but the worst is this (Pre- primary), if not taken care of their whole life is messed up.

The most beautiful thing that has happened in our centre is the installation of paving slabs and drainage. Children feel so good running up and down sometimes we force them to go back to class they just want to play.

No dust no flooding the entire place looks so cool. Parents are very happy and have appreciated a lot.

Classes/Walls/Gutters

Some work in classes has been done like flooring, plastering and putting ventilators. It had been a marathon against time so learners would get everything in place before coming back to school after a very long holiday.

Most walls have been plastered and so waiting to be painted.

In most areas especially where we had water challenge, we made effort to do away with the problem by consulting engineers for advice for the problem made everyone uncomfortable by seeing learners disappear one by one.

The plumbing that remained during the August last year holiday were done perfectly . Hopefully the remaining work will be done maybe in April holidays.

VOCATIONALS

Dressmaking / Tailoring

The vocational training had registered 130 trainees and those who were serious in attending classes were 60 who could make own clothes with very little supervision. 35 are employed, 5 are self employed and the remaining 20 have nothing to do. They come to check if the centre could give them jobs and are told to wait and see if the founder could get chances from the local tailors. Life is very tough out there and without connections, they will stay for years with no work to do.

The remaining group of 70 trainees, 10 dropped out of college due to domestic violence thus parents running away with their teenage children. The remaining number had stopped due to renovations and are yet complete in April 2026 with new trainees starting in the same month but yet additional machines around 10 are needed to add to the current 7 so a big number can get skills. It is our wish that one day one time will see a very big number gets these skills and earn their living.

Computer

The new system of education CBC (competence Based Curriculum) now CBE (Curriculum Based Education) uses technology. Computer learning is liked by all the age groups, from children to adults who haven't got a chance of learning the skill. All learners ask for the laptops frequently, but the laptops are mostly engaged with the small kids. We usually encourage big learners to still wait as we source for more laptops. School learners take turns as their teachers introduce activities. We are hoping to get more laptops to ensure sufficiency in learning.

Bakery

People registered quite a good number last year. We were hoping to start baking classes as soon as the renovation is complete but it was made impossible due to lack of crucial necessities for the bakery. People are still enrolling and patiently waiting for communication and our hope is that things will be well

Kitchen

The kitchen has long been a mess due to smoke thus making the situation worse. We have separated the kitchen with bakery though we not shifted yet because the new kitchen room is not complete. We have installed some ovens which are yet to be used due to lack of some finishing (Canopy).

In addition the cost of living has been very high since corona time, and mostly the cost of food items. We are pleading if we can get a piece of land that we can do farming to cut the cost of food items.
